## **English 102 Final Portfolio: Spring 2016**

This assignment is a compilation of writing that will serve as a reflection of your growth as a writer.

You will assemble a portfolio of your work from this semester. The idea is to show your progression as a writer. In addition to revising your previous works, you will include your major revision and a reflection essay evaluating yourself as a writer. Your portfolio will double as your final and account for 20% of your overall grade.

Format: The portfolio can either be submitted in hard copy or digitally. If you choose to submit it digitally, you will be able to choose the way in which it is created (i.e., website, Google Docs, etc.). You must verify that it has been opened by the instructor to ensure assessment.

## **Required Elements:**

- One AoW: original annotations/response and revised response
- Two Real World Writing pieces: original and revised piece
- One Annotated Bibliography: original and revised bibs
- Major revision: original and revision
- One piece of writing of your choice (this may come from any personal writing or from another class – no revision necessary)
- Reflection essay (2-3 page reflection piece chronicling your growth as a writer reflect on specifically on each of the pieces you included in the portfolio)

<u>Major Revision</u>: While you will be revising and editing all of the writing completed in English 102, you will choose one essay at the end of the semester to revise on a more detailed and comprehensive level. This will be a major revision of the work and a thoughtfully revised and much improved version of the essay that you choose will need to be included in your end of the semester portfolio. Your major revision will be a part of your portfolio grade.

<u>Reflection</u>: Using examples from your own essays, in-class assignments, the assigned readings, research, class lectures, and logs, you will thoroughly assess your new learning and acquired knowledge by relating your learning to your past, present, or future as students, career professionals, local/national/global citizens, etc., and, finally, on a personal level.
